NOTICE OF RACE

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule and for which the international jury may refuse to hold a hearing. This changes RRS 60.1(a) and 63.1.

1. RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in "The Racing Rules of Sailing" (RRS).
- 1.2 No national prescriptions apply.
- 1.3 The International Moth Class Rules apply.
- 1.4 The International Moth Class Championship Guidelines (latest valid version) apply.
- 1.5 RRS Appendix T, Arbitration, applies.
- 1.6 RRS Appendix P, Special Procedures for Rule 42, applies.
- 1.7 A personal flotation device and a helmet shall be worn in competition, from departure until the return ashore.
- 1.8 If there is a conflict between languages, the English text will take precedence.

2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available on the notice board at the event area. There will be no paper version available at registration.

3. COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The official notice board is located at the event area.
- 3.2 [DP][NP] Mobile phones may be carried on board. While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4. [NP] [DP] ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 Competitors shall comply with World Sailing Eligibility Code (Regulation 19).
- 4.2 The championship is open to all boats of the Moth Class with IMCA eligibility.
- 4.3 Each competitor shall be a member of a club affiliated to his national authority of World Sailing.
- 4.4 Competitors under the age of 18 shall present a signed and completed parent or guardian consent and declaration form at registration.
- 4.5 Eligible boats may enter the event by completing the online entry form at the event website www.motheuropeans2024.at and pay the required fees until 12. August 2024. The



Organizing Authority may accept late entries until 13. September 2024. Late entries will be charged an additional fee.

4.6 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.

5. ENTRY FEES

5.1 The entry fees will be as follows:

5.2 The entry fee includes berthing, opening ceremony, regatta dinners and prize giving ceremony for the participant.

5.5 If a competitor withdraws from the event, cancellation fees (percentage of the entry fee based on the date of registration) may be charged as followed:

| Time | Fee (€) |

6. [DP] [NP] ADVERTISING

6.1 In accordance with World Sailing Regulation 20.4.1 boats may be required to display advertising and bow numbers chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

7. QUALIFICATIONS AND FINAL SERIES

7.1 The event may consist of qualification series and final series.

8.2 On the last racing day scheduled, no warning signal will be made after 16.00.

9. [DP] EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

9.1 Each boat shall present a current valid measurement certificate for all equipment and sails at registration.

9.2 Boats may be inspected at any time.

9.3 [DP] Boats shall also comply with RRS 78.1 when attending control.

10. REPLACEMENT OF EQUIPMENT

10.1 Substitution or replacement of equipment during the regatta must comply with the rules and measurement certificate and are subject to measuring at the Race Committee's discretion.

10.2 Competitors shall not change rudders, dagger boards or T-foils whilst afloat – any change of rig or foils must be made on shore at the host venue.

11. VENUE

11.1 The Segelclub Ebensee and the event area is located at Lake Traunsee on the south side of the lake. Important! The event area is not at the Segelclub Ebensee. Refer to Attachment A.

11.2 The race office will be located at the Event area.

11.3 The racing area will be Lake Traunsee, refer to Attachment B.

12. COURSES

12.1 The Courses will be described in the Sailing Instructions.

12.2 The Courses will be windward/leeward.

13. PENALTY SYSTEM

13.1 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the two-turn penalty is replaced by a single-turn penalty.

13.2 An international jury will be appointed in accordance with RRS 91(b). The right of appeal from an International Jury decision is denied as provided in RRS 70.5.

14. SCORING

14.1 RRS Appendix A will apply.

14.2 Five (5) races are required to be completed to constitute a championship.

14.3 (a) If less than 6 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

(b) If 6 to 9 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

(c) If 10 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

15. [NP] [DP] SUPPORT BOATS

15.1 A maximum of five support boats will be permitted for the event. The principle first come first serve applies. The approval of a support boat must be requested at the email address office@scebensee.at and confirmed by the Segelclub Ebensee.



- 15.2 All support person vessels shall be registered with the organizing authority and will be required to comply with local legislation and Event Support Team Regulations that will be published in the Sailing Instructions. The organizing authority may refuse registrations and accept later registrations at their sole discretion.
- 15.3 The organizing authority draws attention to the fact that the responsible drivers of rubber- or other motorboats need to have an Austrian driving license or an equivalent powerboat license of their home country.
- 15.4 Support boats shall be marked with a pink flag with a black "C".
- 15.5 The registration fee for a support boat is €80 and must be paid in cash upon registration.
- 15.6 Support boats shall be insured with a valid (and for the racing area suitable) third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of 1,500,000 EUR per incident or the equivalent.
- 15.7 The Organizing Authority is not responsible for verifying the status or validity of certificates.

16. BERTHING

- 16.1 [DP] [NP] Boats shall remain in their places being allocated, while remaining in the boat park.

17. [DP] MEDIA RIGHTS, CAMERAS AND ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT

- 17.1 Upon registration to the event, competitors agree that photos and videos may be taken of their person and used as part the organizing authority's public relations activities, e.g. via websites, newsletters, print and tv media and social networks. In addition, competitors or their guardians grant to the organizing authority without compensation the unlimited right to use images, photographs, television and radio material produced of them during the event.
- 17.2 Boats may be required to carry cameras, sound equipment and positioning equipment as specified and supplied by the organizing authority.
- 17.3 Competitors may be required to be available for interviews at the event.

18. DATA PROTECTION

- 18.1 The organizers, led by Segelclub Ebensee, herewith would like to disclose what personal information we collect about you with your entry and participation in the race events.
- 18.2 All data regarding participating athletes and their boats will be utilized and archived by us for the purpose of the sporting event. Personal information contains the participant's real name, date of birth, home club, boat type and boat number. In particular, results, calculatory and visual analyses, position monitoring and race analyses will be published with reference to the competitors' names. In order to achieve this, your data will be transferred to our service providers such as PROFS Consulting GmbH, the Moth Class, the Austrian Sailing Federation and to such governing bodies like World Sailing. It cannot be ruled out that your data will be processed outside of the EU. Our service providers and governing bodies have been or will be committed by us, to exclusively use your data for the event and its preparation and postprocessing, including ranking lists. A commercial use of your data is prohibited.
- 18.3 It is the intention of the Organizing Authority to provide relevant information during the event additionally via WhatsApp. The use of WhatsApp is not obligatory. In the interest of the best possible flow of information during the regatta, we encourage you to make use of this offer.

19. RISK STATEMENT

- 19.1 Competitors and support persons participate in the event entirely at their own risk. Rule 3 of the RRS states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to



continue racing is hers alone.” Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that.

- 19.1.1 They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event.
- 19.1.2 They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore.
- 19.1.3 They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions.
- 19.1.4 By participating in any race, they are satisfied that their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate.
- 19.1.5 The provision of a race management team, patrol boats, umpires and other officials and volunteers by the organizer does not relieve them of their own responsibilities.
- 19.1.6 The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
- 19.1.7 It is their responsibility to familiarize themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.
- 19.1.8 World Sailing’s effective Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the class rules as well as the regulations of the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions are to be complied with and are expressly recognized.
- 19.2 Austrian law shall prevail.
- 19.3 Competitors shall present a signed and completed consent and declaration form at registration. For competitors under 18 years of age these forms shall be signed by a parent or guardian.

20. [DP] INSURANCE

- 20.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of 1.500.000 EUR per incident or the equivalent.

21. PRIZES

- 21.1 Prizes will be given as follows:
 - Top 3 overall
 - Top Female
 - Top Master: aged 45 years or older as of 1st June 2024
 - Top Junior: aged 23 years or younger as of 1st June 2024
